BUSINESS OUT OF THE MINUTES

Proposed 2012 Budget

Tom Prout, General Manager provided some updates to the budget information presented at the previous meeting. The ABCA has been approved for a \$10,000 grant from the Shell Foundation Fuelling Change program. The Weston Foundation has approved a grant towards offering residential outdoor education programming at Camp Sylvan to low income schools. The Weston Family Foundation will fund the total cost of \$56,000 for 10 schools in 2012.

Brian Horner, Financial Services Coordinator explained that the preliminary 2012 budget presented at the last meeting had a 16.12% combined levy increase. Staff reviewed the budget and made the project reductions as directed by the Board thereby cutting back the levy to a 9.62% increase. In addition, confirmation of grants and reallocation of wages resulted in a further reduction so the combined levy increase for the 2012 proposed budget is at 5.47%. The revised general levy amount is \$880,572 and the project levy totals \$298,526. A schedule of projects was circulated so that directors are aware of what year the phased projects will be concluded.

PROGRAM REPORTS

1 (a) Development Review

Andrew Bicknell, Regulations Coordinator prepared the report on the Development Review pursuant to Ontario Regulation 147/06 *Development, Interference with Wetlands and Alterations to Shorelines and Watercourses.* Through the application process, proposed developments within regulated areas are protected from flooding and erosion hazards. Staff granted permission for four *Applications for Permission* and five *Minor Works* applications.

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1 (b) Violations update pursuant to O. Reg 147/06

(i) Andrew Bicknell advised that there was a court appearance in early November in regards to the violation in the Municipality of South Huron on Parr Line. The co-owners pleaded guilty and there was a conviction with a minimal fine levied by the court. Through the application process ABCA staff drafted special conditions for restoration within the provincially significant wetland boundary. The landowners are working cooperatively to remove the structure and relocate to an area outside the wetland area. The access laneway will be removed to not restrict flow of drainage works. The concrete pad will be removed and the wetland restored.

2. ABCA Revised Administration Regulations

Tom Prout reviewed the *Administration Regulations* for the Ausable Bayfield Conservation Authority that were adopted in December 21, 2000. A number of revisions were incorporated to update the document for current administrative procedures.

3. Farm Land Rental Tender Results

Kate Monk, Stewardship & Conservation Lands Supervisor provided the tender results for renting the agriculture properties in the Parkhill area. There were eight individuals submit tenders on the two parcels available to rent for a five year term.

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4. Forestry Operations

Ian Jean, Forestry & Stewardship Specialist provided an update on the 2011 forestry management operations. An explanation of the Conservation Land tax Incentive Program and the Managed Forest Tax Incentive Program was given. In total there were 100 acres marked for selective harvest in the ABCA owned hardwood stands. As ground conditions allow, the logging work will be completed in the winter and spring seasons. For most properties this is the first cut of forests that were acquired in the 1950's. The hardwood market is depressed at this time but should rebound. In the conifer plantations, there was 60 acres recommended for thinning in 2011. The price is less lucrative, however thinning of planted pine and spruce is prescribed in order to accelerate the transition to native hardwood species and improve growth of the remaining conifers.

5. 2011 Fall Tree Program

Ian Jean reported that ABCA staff planted 2,639 balled and burlap conifers and potted hardwood trees this fall. The largest project was to plant 1,550 trees for the Ministry of Transportation snow windbreak along Highway # 4 between Clandeboye and Adare Drive. Of note was the Municipality of Lucan Biddulph's commitment to purchase trees and provide them to landowners to replace roadside trees that died or were removed due to being a safety hazard.

6. Conservation Strategy Update

Tim Cumming, Communication Specialist presented an update on the development of the new Conservation Strategy. Over the past 12 months, a group of community volunteers representing the watershed and others with an interest in the watershed met monthly to create a long-range guiding document. It has been 20 years since the ABCA engaged the community in developing a conservation strategy, vision and mission statement.

Through the development process, the team took part in using social media tools such as Facebook, Wiki, Twitter and You Tube. This was a pilot project identified in implementing the ABCA Social Media policy. Another aspect of the conservation strategy process was providing feedback on a new ABCA logo.

The completed draft of the *Conservation Strategy* document is being reviewed by the development team and when finalized, will be brought to the December Board of Directors meeting for consideration.

Of particular interest to the ABCA is the environmental integrity pillar and natural environment actions. Huron County is the only county in Southwestern Ontario where the population is declining. The draft document is available.
