Shoreline property owners and other interested people have started to provide written comments to us on the *Draft Consultant Recommendation Report*. We thank you for review of the document and your interest in the Report and for having provided your written comments.

The Ausable Bayfield Conservation Authority (ABCA) released this report on September 1, 2016 for 90 days of public review and written comments. The comment period continues until December 1, 2016.

# How you can continue to be engaged

In addition to keeping you up-to-date through this newsletter, the Ausable Bayfield Conservation Authority plans to hold two public open houses in 2017 – one in the north of the watershed and one in the south of the watershed. It is expected the two open houses will take place in late spring or early summer. The locations will also be selected to be in close proximity to the shoreline.

After the date is set, ABCA staff will send out notice of the public events to all subscribers to the newsletter and post on the website. Ausable Bayfield Conservation Authority has not made any policy changes at this time and has not accepted the recommendations proposed by the Consulting Team at this time.

#### The Process Moving Forward

The Ausable Bayfield Conservation Authority, and the Steering Committee for the Shoreline Management Plan Update, will consider your written comments on the *Draft Consultant Recommendation Report*, along with the consultants' recommendations, before the commencement of local policy development and SMP updates in 2017.

### About the Shoreline Management Plan Update

Ausable Bayfield Conservation Authority's first Shoreline Management Plan was approved in 1994. It was created to help address shoreline hazards related to flooding, erosion, and dynamic beaches in ABCA watersheds. That plan, created with the help of the community, has reduced damage along the shoreline during severe storms and high water events. This plan was last updated in 2000. It is time to update this important plan again.

ABCA started the Update work in 2015 and had originally planned to complete the update of the Shoreline Management Plan (SMP) before the end of 2016. The primary focus of the Ausable Bayfield Conservation Authority Shoreline Management Plan is to address the shoreline hazards for flooding, erosion, and dynamic beaches and their impact on shoreline development.

The *Draft Consultant Recommendation Report* document is based on current scientific knowledge and provincial policies and was prepared by the consulting team.

The consulting team was led by Karen Wianecki, of Planning Solutions Inc., Judy Sullivan, of Aqua Solutions 5 Inc., and Robin Davidson-Arnott, University of Guelph. This update is needed to meet our commitment to provide a consistent and up-to-date guide for development and municipal land use planning along the shoreline. The Shoreline Management Plan should reflect current mapping, legislation, policies, guidelines, technical information related to shoreline hazards, and current land use trends along the Lake Huron shoreline.

The Ausable Bayfield Conservation Authority has invited a Steering Committee, with representation from diverse shoreline and industry interests, to oversee the process to develop the Updated Shoreline Management Plan.

We have also retained the services of an experienced consulting team to assist with technical work. The consulting team has prepared the *Draft Consultant Recommendation Report* which is currently posted for public review and written comments until December 1, 2016. **Thank you**
